At the time of this meeting crime had decreased 90% from the year before.

John explained that our **Problem Solving Officer** (PSO) is a resource for the neighborhood to share problems and provide guidance. In general, the PSO patrols at least twice daily, and we are encouraged to call in to report suspicious activity. Safety tips from our PSO included: be alert in and out of your home, lock doors and windows, make sure there are no ladders, benches, or garbage cans outside windows that can be used for breaking and entering. Other suggestions he presented are: leave a few lights on at night, get to know your neighbors, and be sure to participate in participate in National Night Out (NNO).


All You Need is Love!


